Picnic in the Park returns on Friday, August 1st



The 8th Annual Raleigh Park picnic will be held this year on Friday August 1st from 5:30 to 8:30 pm at Raleigh Park. The children's events include the "Jumpy House," the

Reptile Man, a Puppeteer Show, Face Painting, "Come Clay With Me," and the Children's Raffle. Raffle prizes will include a girl's bike, a boy's bike, a soccer ball, a portable CD player, and a "Boom" box along with four baskets of toys from TreeHouse Toys. An adult raffle will feature a basket of cookies from Cookies by Design, a Cookbook donated by a neighbor, a power tool from Parr Lumber, and possibly four cases of wine from Champoeg Wine Cellars. In addition, the adult raffle includes five \$10 lunch certificates from McCormicks and a Les Schwab certificate for an alignment. Food will be available from Belagio Pizza that includes pizza (\$2.50 a slice or \$14.00 for a whole pizza), and salads and drinks for a dollar. The West Slope Espresso shop will provide desserts with selection and cost to be determined. The Raleigh Park Neighborhood Association will receive 15% of proceeds from food sales. The "Kane Wembley Coalition" will provide the music for the picnic. We still need volunteers for the usual duties of setting up, cleaning up, and helping during the picnic. 


