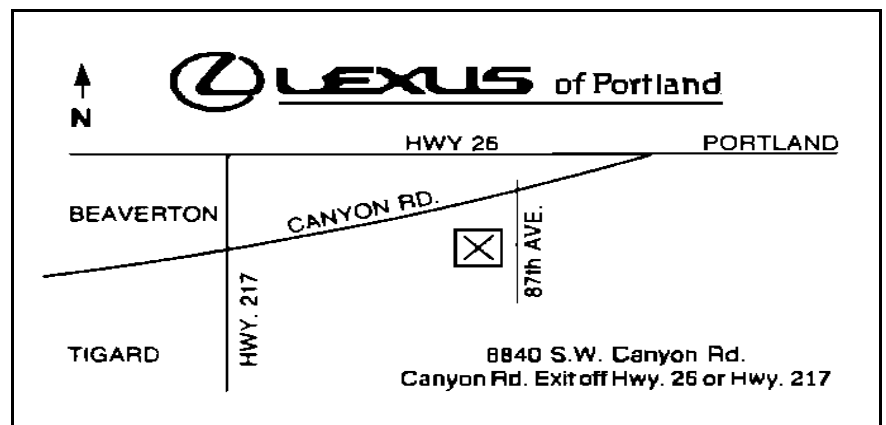

Raleighwood Marsh

The Raleighwood Marsh has become a restoration project of the ongoing Fanno Creek Watershed Plan (FCWP) adopted by Clean Water Services of Washington County in 1997. The Raleighwood

Marsh project seeks to improve water quality, manage sediment loading in the stream, and floodwater conveyance in Sylvan Creek. Clean Water Services has removed the rock weir as recommended by the regulatory agencies, because these agencies felt it would reestablish stream functioning more quickly and would not pose significant negative impacts to fish or wildlife. Clean Water Services has also moved ahead with weed-whipping approximately 10 feet on each side of the main stream channel. This will facilitate water moving through the channel this winter and eliminate some of the invasive reed canary grass along the channel.
